

Percy Boomer, possibly unintentionally, created one of the most comprehensive early golf book library's of pre 1949 golf books. No doubt created due to his thirst for knowledge, and a collectors mentality.

Virtually every early instruction book, architecture, ladies titles are included, plus an abundance of early reference, annuals, periodicals, humour, fiction and agronomy books.

Many instructional titles contain hand written notes and underlining, slowly building Percy's knowledge and understanding his principles to a golf swing, which would culminate in his timeless Classic "On Learning Golf" published in 1942.

Early reference's, periodicals and annuals show his passion for golf history, rare classic titles, George Robb's 1863 Historical Gossip, Farnie's Golfers Manual (1862 2nd edition), Marsh's Blackheath Golfing Lays (2 copies), a complete run golf and golf Illustrated 1891-1906, every edition (Large Paper 1876, 1st 1875, 2nd 1893 and 3rd 1899) of Robert Clarks Golf: A Royal and Ancient Game. The Reverend John Kerrs Golf Book of East Lothian large and small paper editions! Architecture titles by MacKenzie, Colt and Alison, Wethered and Simpson's (large paper edition!), George Thomas, Robert Hunter...

Percy used the bibliographies of Hilton and Smith, Harry B. Wood and Cecil Hopkinson's classic references to find and cross reference his search to build the library, notes in these books are abundant!

His choice of humour reflects on light hearted character, Irwin's Golf Sketches, Aikeman's Pen and Pencil Sketches, Hillinthorn's Your first Game of Golf along with the collectors mentality to track such rare books down.

Multiple copies are frequently present, confirming again his collector mentality of not wanting to leave a good book behind!

Obviously Percys pupils knew of his passion, many books being gifted and inscribed to him, including gifts from Prince Edward!

This was the first weekly magazine on golf, and is still being published today as "Golf Weekly." Reports on important events like the Open Championship, often within days of it finishing, offering a unique insight into the history of golf. Also, it features articles on famous players, interesting stories and events, the opening of new courses, competition results, advertisements for the various golf equipment, and more.

There are 19 volumes, one volume bound in two, and several of the early volumes not bound exact to the correct page numbers, but all page for 18 volumes present, only missing 3 contents pages to early volumes, but we can supply copies of the missing pages.

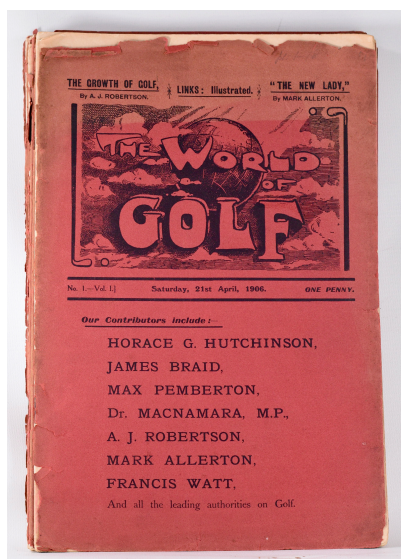
The first thirty volumes, seldom seen offered together in a single collection. Individually, these magazines are extremely difficult to obtain.

For a complete run like this, nothing comparable, as a research resource, documenting golfs first boom years.

Albert Warren "Tillie" Tillinghast (May 7, 1876 – May 19, 1942) was an American golf course architect. Tillinghast was one of the most prolific architects in the history of golf; he worked on more than 265 different courses. He was inducted into the World Golf Hall of Fame in 2015.

Tillinghast was born in 1874 in Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, the son of Benjamin Collins Tillinghast, owner of a rubber goods company there. He lived with his wife Lillian in Beverly Hills, California and died at his daughter's home in Toledo, Ohio in 1942.[4] He had two daughters, including Elsie May Tillinghast Brown (1898–1974).

Tillinghast-designed courses have hosted multiple professional golf major championships—the 1927 and 1949 PGA Championships, contested at Cedar Crest Park, and Hermitage Country Club, respectively; the U.S. Open in 2002 and 2009, contested at the Black Course of Bethpage State Park. the 2005 and 2016 PGA Championship, contested at Baltusrol Golf Club, which has also been the host of seven U.S. Opens; the 2006 U.S. Open, contested at Winged Foot Golf Club; and many others. He also designed the course at the Ridgewood Country Club, used for the 1935 Ryder Cup and Scarborough Golf and Country Club in Toronto, host of the Canadian Open for four occasions. In 1916, he created the Municipal Golf Course, now called Brackenridge Park Golf Course in San Antonio, Texas which hosted the Texas Open from 1922 to 1959. He also designed Oak Hills Country Club in San Antonio, which hosted the Texas Open 24 times between 1960 and 1994.

In Westchester County (New York) alone, among the most noted of the sixteen courses that Tillinghast designed there are Fenway Golf Club, Scarsdale; Wykagyl Country Club, New Rochelle; Old Oaks Country Club, Purchase; Quaker Ridge Golf Club, Scarsdale; Scarsdale Golf Club, Hartsdale, where he designed the back nine; Briar Hall Golf & Country Club (now Trump National Golf Club Westchester) and Sleepy Hollow Country Club in Briarcliff Manor; and Winged Foot Golf Club (East & West), Mamaroneck. Another notable Tillinghast golf course was created specifically for Paramount Pictures founder Adolf Zukor in 1920, now known as Paramount Country Club, in Rockland County, New York. Tillinghast was also the uncredited co-designer of several green complexes at Century Country Club in Purchase.
